## HISTORICAL SPOTLIGHT

In each of our Centennial 2021 Newsletters, we will focus on some of our "Partners." Currently we have 68 ..but we eventually hope to have 100 marking the 100th Anniversary of Sarasota County!

#### DESOTO ACRES TURNS 100 on FEBRUARY 3, 2021

Unique in Sarasota County, DeSoto Acres is the oldest sub-division established outside of Sarasota city limits. It was founded by William Van Dame, a Chicago businessman who moved here in 1923. During the Florida land boom, he bought large tracts of land in North County including the solid block of land from the Seaboard Air Line Railway to Lockwood Ridge Road and County Line Road (now University Parkway) to 27th Street. In 1928, he gave Sarasota County the right-of-way connection from 27th Street to the County line. DeSoto Acres started with Van Dames vision for what he called "Van Dame Estates."



It was an unusual vision for the time. A 1928 ad stated: "Ideal for suburban homes – poultry ranches & small farms." Van Dame Estates was legally established on February 3, 1921 per the deed execution.

The estates slowly grew from inception through the 1940's. When Sarasota County replatted the area on March 4, 1945, Van Dame Estates changed its name to DeSoto Acres. The majority of existing homes were built in the 1950's & 60's followed by homes built in the 70's. The earliest home dates from 1925. The home most recently built was in 2014.

Current zoning no longer allows farm animals. Horses have been a constant in DeSoto Acres as they are not considered farm animals. The most defining character of DeSoto Acres is its large lots. Sarasota County's historical zoning maps (1960-75) shows all of the DeSoto Acres area zoned E for Estate...one house for one acre. The Sarasota County zoning code updated in the 70's ...designated the DeSoto Acres area RE-1, Residential Estate meaning one house for two acres. This was codified November 11, 1975 in the County Zoning Code.

DeSoto Acres residents have quite a diverse domestic and native animal population. Residents have horses, dogs, cats & peacocks. Native and migrating animals include bald eagles, ospreys, sandhill cranes, hawks, herons, fox, coyotes and every so often, a bobcat.

Architecture was never part of the original deed restrictions as testified by the variety of styles seen in DeSoto Acres. This variety has appealed to those who made DeSoto Acres their home. The one thing residents have in common is their choice to live in DeSoto Acres on large naturally landscaped lots, with native animals in the heart of an urban environment. Today as development encroaches all around DeSoto Acres perimeter, its residents are united in the goal of preserving the uniqueness of this community.





- 3. Each Ambassador receives an appropriate Centennial 2021 certificate.
- 4. The satisfaction of helping the Sarasota County Community mount a meaningful celebration of its 100th birthday.
