April and May 1921 turned out to be the critical months in the struggle for a separate Sarasota County. In late March the Sarasota Chamber of Commerce hired E.J. Delbert as Secretary. As the Chamber's first full-time staff member, Delbert took the lead in organizing the campaign for separation.

On April 7 the Chamber's board of directors approved the wording of a bill to submit to the Florida legislature and named former State Senator Augustus Wilson of Myakka as their lobbyist. A week later Wilson wrote from Tallahassee that the bill would be introduced on April 14. He predicted an easy passage—and he could not have been more wrong!

The Bradentown Chamber of Commerce sent a large delegation to the state capital that succeeded in blocking passage of the Sarasota County bill. In desperation the Sarasotans sought a meeting with their opponents in late April. In mainly private negotiations held in Bradentown, the Sarasota representatives agreed to change the boundaries of the proposed new county by ceding four townships or 144 square miles of the northeast section back to Manatee County in return for an end to opposition to the creation of Sarasota County.

By May 12 both houses of the legislature passed the Sarasota bill unanimously and Governor Cary Hardee signed it into law. The fight for independence was not quite over pending the results of a referendum on the act in the Sarasota district, but the greatest hurdles had been successfully cleared.

It was a frantic time that tested the nerve and political skills of the Sarasota district leaders. In the end their careful planning and organization and their ability to unite people and communities throughout the district carried them to ultimate victory.

Now, one hundred years later, the county they created is celebrating their achievement. Already hundreds of events, lecture, concerts, and many other programs have been held or are scheduled. Additional activities are in the planning stage.

I call everyone's attention to two websites dedicated to the Sarasota County Centennial. In one section you will find a series of Centennial Auto Tours available for FREE downloading on cell phones and iPads. It's a great way to see our county and learn more about its history. Another useful section is the Centennial Calendar that includes all Centennial activities in the county.

A second site also well worth visiting https://www.sarasotacounty100.com has been organized by the Sarasota County Division of Libraries and Historical Resources. It contains among many other things historical photographs, virtual museum displays of Centennial artifacts, and a calendar of other Centennial programs organized by the Division, including One Book/One Community events that feature Centennial themes.

### **Brief History of Women's Sertoma Club of Venice**



Sertoma exists for the high and noble purpose of **SER**vice **TO MA**nkind by communication of thoughts, ideas and concepts to accelerate human progress in health, education, freedom and democracy. Based in Kansas City, Missouri, the organization was founded on April 11, 1912. Over the years, individual members have brought forward their talents and joined the collective experience of thousands to chart a unique course of action for community service.

Originally Sertoma International didn't allow women in their clubs. In the middle 80s several wives of members of the Sertoma Club of Venice formed, under the auspices of Sertoma International, a separate unit called La Sertoma. When women were allowed to join, it transformed into Women's Sertoma Club of Venice. It was chartered in December of 1988. The club held its first meeting in January 1989.

Women's Sertoma has been evolving over the years and we have gone from raising our funds at the Wellfield concession stand, making hotdogs in a frying pan and endless trips to Sams Club buying candy and chips, popcorn for our popcorn machine we got for free and changing out our own soda machines to putting on one of the biggest events in Venice. We have been doing the Sun Fiesta since 1993 when the event went bankrupt. We paid the \$33,000 debt that was owed to various business and the City of Venice in three years.



Our main event is the annual Sun Fiesta which the Women's Sertoma has sponsored and organized. The first official Sun Fiesta was in October 1973. It was originated to provide the community its last chance to get together before the 'snow birds' started migrating in November. Sun Fiesta has remained one of the most beloved events of the year for the citizens of Venice. The event takes place in Centennial Park in downtown Venice and includes arts & crafts, food, music, dancing, entertainment, the Miss Sun Fiesta Pageant, free admission, free parking and so much more!

We also raised money selling poinsettias and carnations on St. Patrick's Day. We worked golf tournaments and were always able to give out scholarships and help needy families with gifts at Christmas. Since its inception, the Women's Sertoma Club of Venice has contributed over \$1 million to support the needs of the community.

Our main focus has been and will continue to be scholarships to women going to college and returning to school after being in the workforce. We also support various charities in the area whose main mission it is to aid women and children. In keeping with Sertoma's mission to aid in hearing and speech, we continue to support the Sertoma Club of Venice's speech and hearing clinic in Venice.




